**VALLEY COUNTYWIDE EMS DISTRICT
VALLEY COUNTY, IDAHO
TO LEVY A SPECIAL TAX LEVY**

Shall the Board of Commissioners of the Valley Countywide EMS District be authorized and empowered to increase its levy and budget, pursuant to Idaho Code Section 63-802(1)(a), to defray its costs of staffing, equipping, and maintaining the District's operations to provide ambulance transport and emergency medical services throughout Valley County. Specifically, an increase in the District's budget from property tax, beyond the amount the District is currently authorized to levy pursuant to Idaho Code § 63-802, by the sum of TWO MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED FORTY TWO THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED THIRTY FIVE and No/100th Dollars (\$2,742,635.00), commencing Fiscal Year 2024-2025, and which amount shall then be added to the District's current established base budget amount for the purposes of Idaho Code § 63-802.

STATEMENT: The levy will be used to fund all District operations and will be a tax increase of \$24.23 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based upon current conditions.

**SPECIAL GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ELECTION
JOINT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 421,
VALLEY AND ADAMS COUNTIES, STATE OF IDAHO
May 21, 2024**

QUESTION: Shall the Board of Trustees of Joint School District No. 421, Valley and Adams Counties, State of Idaho (the "District"), be authorized to issue general obligation school bonds of said District in the principal amount of up to \$14,000,000 for the purpose of financing the costs of acquisition, construction and equipping of new workforce housing for District employees, such bonds to become due in such installments as may be fixed by the Board, the final installment of such bonds to fall due not later than fifteen (15) years from the date of issuance thereof, all as provided in the Resolution adopted by the Board on March 18, 2024?

The interest rate anticipated on the proposed bonds based upon current market rates is one and three and fifteen hundredths percent (3.15%) per annum. The amount to be repaid over the life of the bonds, based on the anticipated interest rate, is \$17,931,081, consisting of \$14,000,000 in principal and \$3,931,081 of interest.

The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed bonds is a tax of \$12.23 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions. As of May 21, 2024, the total existing bonded indebtedness of the District, including interest accrued, is \$26,156,193.

**JOINT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 421,

The Board of Trustees of Joint School District No. 421, Valley and Adams Counties, State of Idaho, is seeking authorization to levy a Supplemental Levy for the following purposes and approximate amount of levy funds to be allocated to each use:

TOTAL ANNUAL LEVY AMOUNT:	\$650,000/year

QUESTION: Shall the Board of Trustees of Joint School District No. 421, Valley and Adams Counties, State of Idaho, be authorized and empowered to levy a Supplemental Levy in the amount of Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$650,000) per year for two (2) years, commencing with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2026, for the purposes stated above; all as provided in the Resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees on March 18, 2024?

The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed levy is a tax of \$6.65 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions.

**SPECIAL MUNICIPAL BOND ELECTION
WATER REVENUE BONDS
CITY OF MCCALL
VALLEY COUNTY, STATE OF IDAHO
May 21, 2024**

THE CITY OF MCCALL, VALLEY COUNTY, IDAHO, HAS DETERMINED THAT IT IS IN THE INTEREST OF THE PUBLIC, AND NECESSARY FOR PURPOSES OF IMPROVED WATER QUALITY, TO FINANCE THE RENOVATION, IMPROVEMENT, AND UPGRADE OF THE CITY'S WATER SYSTEM, INCLUDING INCREASED TREATMENT AND STORAGE CAPACITY. IMPROVEMENTS MUST BE MADE AND CAN BE PAID FOR AS FINANCED TO KEEP UPFRONT WATER RATE INCREASES LOWER AND MORE AFFORDABLE OR WITH CASH FROM HIGHER UPFRONT WATER RATE INCREASES (UP TO 100%). EACH SERIES OF BONDS SHALL BE PAID SOLELY FROM REVENUES GAINED FROM WATER CUSTOMER FEES AND WILL HAVE NO EFFECT ON PROPERTY TAXES.

SHALL THE CITY OF MCCALL, IDAHO, BE AUTHORIZED TO KEEP UPFRONT WATER RATE INCREASES LOWER AND MORE AFFORDABLE BY ISSUING AND SELLING ONE OR MORE SERIES OF REVENUE BONDS UP TO \$16,500,000, OVER THE NEXT 10 YEARS TO FINANCE THE RENOVATION, IMPROVEMENT, AND UPGRADE OF THE CITY'S WATER SYSTEM?

The following information is required by § 34-913, Idaho Code:

The purpose for which the proposed bonds are to be used, the date of the special bond election (May 21, 2024), and the principal amount of the bonds are set forth above on the ballot or in the City's bond election Ordinance No. 1023. The interest rate anticipated on the proposed bonds based on current market rates is 3.83% per annum but will be fixed at time of each series issuance.

The total amount to be repaid over the life of the proposed bonds based on the anticipated interest rate, is estimated to be \$24,136,750, consisting of \$16,500,000 in principal and \$7,636,750 in interest. Principal and interest on the proposed bonds will be paid solely from the net revenues of the City's wastewater system and no taxes will be levied by the City for such purposes. Accordingly, the estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed bonds based on the data above is a tax of \$0.00 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions. Each series of proposed bonds will mature over a period not to exceed twenty (20) years.

The total existing indebtedness, including interest accrued as of May 21, 2024, of the City is \$3,485,911. The total existing indebtedness of the City's Water Fund, including interest accrued as of May 21, 2024, is \$0.
